Letter Requesting the Sacrament of Confirmation

Please use the following format as a guide for composing your own letter asking to be Confirmed. There is no length stipulation. Letters can either be typed or neatly handwritten. Your signature at the bottom should be a real signature – not a typed one. This is a formal request letter. Please put a lot of reflection into this and present your best work!

Letters are to be addressed to Fr. Michal Twaruzek and handed in to your catechist.

Dear Father Twaruzek,

(Paragraph 1) Describe **WHO** you are. You might mention where you go to school; something about your family; some outside activity you enjoy. Give Father a “snapshot” of yourself in words.

(Paragraph 2) Tell Father **WHY** you want to be Confirmed. What does this mean to you? What does it mean for your relationship with God?

(Paragraph 3) Tell Father **WHAT** you have done to prepare for Confirmation. Describe classes you have attended, retreats you have attended, work done with your sponsor, are you regularly attending Mass, how has your prayer life changed, what have you come to understand about the Holy Spirit, etc.?

(Paragraph 4) Share with Father what **FIAT** projects you have participated in and what your experience was. How do you feel called to be an active member of the parish after your Confirmation?

(Conclusion) Thank Father for his service to our parish and for considering your request. You may mention that you are looking forward to receiving the Sacrament, etc.
